



# YAHYA SINWAR

Yahya Sinwar has been appointed as the new leader of Hamas's Political Bureau, marking a significant shift in the group's leadership. Sinwar, known for his pragmatic approach, has established strong ties with the Egyptian government and Mohammed Dahlan, which could lead to increased cooperation between local civil currents in Gaza. His leadership is seen as beneficial for Arab governments, particularly Egypt, which views him as a stabilizing force compared to his predecessor, Khaled Mashal.

Sinwar's tenure is expected to facilitate better relations with Egypt, and his previous efforts to disengage Hamas from the Muslim Brotherhood are noted. His relationships with various Palestinian factions, including released PLO leaders like Marwan Barghouti, suggest potential for de-escalation and normalization within the region.

In Hamas's current structure, key figures include:

- Yahya Sinwar: Leader of Hamas in Gaza and the new head of the Political Bureau.
- Khalil al-Hayya: Deputy head of Hamas's regional Politburo in Gaza and primary negotiator.
- Abu Marzouk: Influential in shaping public opinion through Qatar.



#### ABBAS INTERVIEW WITH SPUTNIK

Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas recently spoke with Sputnik about several critical issues:

- Government Formation: Negotiations for a national unity government in Palestine will resume after the Gaza war, contingent on Hamas's acceptance of reconciliation terms.
- General Elections: Abbas emphasized that elections cannot occur until Palestinians in East Jerusalem can participate, citing Israeli restrictions as the reason for the delay.
- Financial Disputes: The Palestinian Authority plans to seek international court intervention if Israel does not return withheld tax revenues, as stipulated by the Paris Agreements of 1994.

Abbas also condemned the assassination of Hamas leader Ismail Haniyeh, attributing it to efforts to prolong the Gaza conflict and hinder peace negotiations. He affirmed that Gaza should be governed by the Palestinian Authority and reiterated support for a political solution based on international resolutions.
