

### **Senate Confirmation**



Marco Rubio, recently confirmed by the Senate as the United States Secretary of State, has articulated a clear stance on the Ukraine conflict. During his confirmation hearing, Rubio emphasized that the official U.S. position should be to seek an end to the ongoing war.

He noted that achieving peace would be challenging and called for realistic expectations, suggesting initial steps could include a ceasefire and mutual concessions by both Russia and Ukraine.

Rubio has indicated skepticism about Ukraine's capacity to reclaim all territories lost since the onset of Russia's special

military operation, hinting at the potential easing of anti-Russian sanctions as part of broader peace negotiations.

#### **Gaza Conflict**

#### China
